




Criminal Justice

Students enrolled in the Criminal Justice CTE Program will gain the knowledge and skills necessary to become career and college ready in many areas of public safety and protective Services. Students will gain an understanding of the importance of becoming a public servant, learn to work independently as a part of a team, develop highly effective written and verbal communications and improve their leadership skills.

In addition to time spent in the classroom, students will participate in weekly physical training. Students gain knowledge of pre-enrollment phsyical fitness minimum standards test (MCOLES) for entrance into academy programs as well as compete in



activities.
